

15. **Do the rounds of pounds and animal shelters yourself** - go at least once a week. Daily phone calls to these facilities can be made but there is nothing like checking for yourself. If your pet is taken into a pound or shelter it will be held for 7 days if found to be without any traceable identification and 14 days if microchipped or having some sort of other traceable identification.
16. **Check each cage carefully** – sometimes you may not recognise your pet, particularly if it is frightened and huddled in the corner or under a bed. Ask at each facility where the injured strays are kept, as usually these will be housed in a separate area.
17. **Contact pet finding organisations** such as Pet Search who, for a fee, will help you search all of the pounds and shelters.
18. **Make up leaflets with a description of your pet** and drop them in letter boxes and put signs up around your area.
19. **If you have recently moved, check your old home regularly.** Leave food out in the place you used to feed your pet and ask neighbours to keep an eye out and contact you if they should see your pet. Put up signs and do a "letter box" drop in this area also.
20. **Ask our staff for a list of pounds** in your area to help you in your search.

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### **MOST IMPORTANT OF ALL...**

*Keep looking!! Even if it is weeks after your pet went missing. Sometimes people that find stray animals keep them for a while before handing them in or perhaps your pet was so frightened whilst lost that it took a while before anyone could catch it and take it to a pound or Shelter.*

*There are many cases where lost pets have been reunited with owners many months after they went missing!!*
