The RSPCA, of course, is a charity, relying almost entirely on donations from the public.

A quarter of RSPCA income is derived from bequests - People who love animals enough to leave the RSPCA a gift in their will. Or, people who leave us a bequest to ensure their pet receives the best possible care after they're gone.

These people are all part of our Bequest program. Our Legacy pets have 24 hour vet care, regular good quality meals, interesting and safe places to live and regular human contact with qualified RSPCA NSW staff and caring volunteers.

There are two options available to anyone who wants to join the Legacy Pet Program. You can leave us a gift in your will, or make a cash donation of a determined sum, if and when, you can no longer care for your pet. A classic example is where an elderly person has to go into a care facility which doesn't allow pets.

Anyone whose pet becomes part of the Legacy Pet Program is automatically invited to become a member of the Animal Friends Society. Members meet the animals they're helping, and socialise with other members of the Program.

It's a chance for the RSPCA to celebrate your support during your lifetime.
