

MICROCHIPPING IS NOT REGISTRATION




Your animal needs a microchip.



But a microchip does NOT register your animal.



Your pet's microchip holds your contact details, so your pet can find you if it gets lost.



IN NSW, ALL CATS AND DOGS MUST BE REGISTERED

- Register your animals online or at your local council's office.
- The RSPCA can NOT register your animal for you.



ANIMALS NEED TO BE REGISTERED BY 12 WEEKS OLD

- If you get an animal older than 12 weeks old, and it is not already registered, register the animal straight away.
- If your pet is not registered by 12 weeks old, you can get a fine.

HOW TO REGISTER



You need a MyService NSW account.



You need to pay a fee. It is cheaper for desexed animals.



No account? The council can help.
